Fathers play a critical role in the health and development of their children, with evidence demonstrating fathers' potential to positively influence their children's health, social success and academic achievements.

An effective and engaged father or father-figure can lead to: Increased:

Student connectedness with school

- Social and emotional development
- Physical activity and positive health outcomes
- Self-esteem
- Resilience
- Social responsibility, maturity and life skills

Decreased:

- Engagement in unhealthy and risk behaviour
- Alcohol, tobacco and drug use
- Suicide and self-harm
- Delinquent behaviour
- Bullying behaviours



Why Fathers are Important in the School

We would like to share some of this evidence with you to show just how much you matter to your children, their education, and their life at school. This evidence does not show fathers' influence as superior to that of mothers, but as a separate, important factor in children's successful transition though infancy to adulthood. A fathers' influence on children's cognitive development, social skills, mental health, literacy, and math's achievement is found to be different to that of mothers.

Top Tips

- Children with an engaged and positive father figure do better in school.
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- Children, whose fathers engage with the school, are more connected to school and less likely to have behaviour issues.
- Children with fathers who have very high parental consistency from the age of 4 to 12, perform better in reading and writing.

More Tips:

- Fathers play an important role in boosting children's confidence, self-esteem, and resilience.
- Children with engaged and supportive fathers, are less likely to engage in negative and unhealthy behaviours.
- Fathers have a significant impact on their child's wellbeing, happiness, and life satisfaction.

Not only have fathers been shown to have a significant impact on academic achievement, but children's attitude towards learning and school is also very strongly influences by their father. So, if you model and encourage a love of learning you will be setting your child up for success throughout their lives.



Wellbeing Check

Fathers who have close connections with their children have better mental health and wellbeing outcomes. So, engage with your kids because not only are you supporting their wellbeing, you are also supporting your own.


