Last Friday, the staff gathered to finish off their Professional Learning Project on which they have been working for the past 2 years. They have focussed specifically on reading and writing under the guidance of Julia Blakey from MACS and the staff have said that it has been some of the most powerful and effective learning they have done, which means it has had a great impact directly on the teaching of your children. I am so proud of the work and effort the staff put in to educating the children here at St Mary's. They are easily the hardest working staff I have ever come across and they work so hard because they realise the importance of literacy and numeracy skills for our children and their future.

We also looked at our MACSSIS data, which is the survey that you as families, the students and the staff fill out every year. It gives us good comparative data on how we are performing against all other MACS schools while also comparing the data to our own data over the past two years so we can see where we have improved, where we have dipped and where we can improve.



Prep: Inquiry


For Inquiry, we have been learning to teach others about what we love. We created drawings of what we love and labelled parts of the drawing.













Prep: Literacy
