Confirmation


We congratulate our 2021 Confirmation candidates who made their Confirmation at the end of Term 2, on the 23rd and 24th of June.

October is the month of the Rosary


Did you know?

In the Middle Ages, a time when the "Hail Mary" prayer became widely known, it was

common for people to pray 150 Hail Marys. This developed into the rosary as it is prayed today.

In 2002, the rosary was enriched by the addition of five new mysteries suggested by Pope John Paul II. These are called the Luminous mysteries and are a testament to the fact that the rosary continues to inspire prayer and new ways to

engage with Christ.

Religious Education in 3/4JR!

The students of 3/4JR began their Religious Education in Term 3 by investigating scripture stories and passages from the New Testament. Here are some students from 3/4JR that have used their own words to explain key scripture passages from the Gospel of Mark..



Scarlette - Jesus Has Risen: "Jesus was the Son of God but not many believed that. Jesus had a thorn crown put on him and he got whacked by soldiers lots of times and he was forced to carry his own cross to Golgotha and there he was nailed next to two criminals. Late in the afternoon Jesus was laid in the tomb and the tomb had a stone that was rolled over. Three days later the stone was not there anymore and Jesus was standing before them. Jesus had risen."

Hayden - John the Baptist: "John lived in the desert and he ate grass in honey. As John was baptising people Jesus told John to baptise him and heaven opened up. This was in the new testament."





Gurleen - Feeding the Five Thousand: "Jesus and his disciples fed five thousand people. There were only seven loaves of bread and some small fish but Jesus blessed the food. Then after there was enough bread and fish to feed the five thousand."
