




Read the scenarios below and write a response explaining how these students could make better choices and follow the St Mary's School expectations and rules.

Internet Safety

Protecting your privacy when you are online

- ALWAYS set your profile to PRIVATE on all social media sites, apps and chat rooms
 - ❖ If you are not sure how to do this, ask someone you trust at home or at school.
- Do not share personal information unnecessarily on your social media profiles
 - (phone numbers, date of birth, personal email addresses, passwords, home address and the name of your school or photos of you in your school uniform).

Use good password habits

Strong passwords are random and long as it makes it harder for others to crack. It is important that passwords are kept a secret.

Remember your online reputation

- Every time you use the internet you are building an online reputation based on the things you do and say online. This online reputation is like a footprint and it never goes away.
- It is important that you take care of your own online reputation and the online reputation of others by not posting comments, images or videos involving others without their permission.

Think before you post or share

- ❖ Even if your profile is set to private, that does not control what your friends will do with the information you post online. Always think how you would feel if your information or photo was shared with strangers.
- ❖ Posting offensive or inappropriate material of yourself or others online can have many consequences. This material can affect social lives, academic results or your ability to get a job in the future as it all adds to your online reputation. It can also end you up in trouble with the law.
- Most photos contain information about the time, date and GPS location of where the photo was taken so it is important that you make sure this information is not being shared publicly.
- ❖ In the terms and conditions of many social media sites (which most people never read) you are often ticking a box and agreeing to these sites taking ownership of your photos and videos and giving them permission to sell and share the information they contain with other sources.
